Pastor's perspective continued

How are your New Year's Resolutions coming? Statistics tell us that the vast majority of resolutions made going into a new year have failed by this point. So please don't feel bad if that describes you! But such statistics should tell us something about change, which is that lasting change cannot come through self-effort, it can only come by being transformed by God's grace through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Last month in my newsletter article I suggested that the biblical pathway to change is not trying harder, but putting ourselves in the way of God's grace so that he can change us to make us more like Jesus. The steps we take to put ourselves in the way of God's grace are what theologians call "means of grace." And so I am using these first few months of 2025 to explore various means of grace, so that we can get in the way and stay in the way of God's transforming grace throughout 2025. This month our focus is on one of the most important means of grace: The Word of God.

Clearly the bible, God's spoken Word, is a transformative means of grace. The Psalmist in the passage above sings about the beauty of God's Word and how it not only teaches him but gives him wisdom, insight, and even works in his heart to make him hate what is wrong. The author of Hebrews offers a similar assessment of God's Word: "For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12). The Word of God not only works in our minds to give us knowledge and wisdom from God, but even more importantly works in our heart to change us from the inside out.

Sadly, many Christians only engage with God's Word on Sunday mornings through a sermon or a Scripture reading, or when they read a short verse through a devotional. But for God's Word to have the transformative impact it has for the psalmist, we certainly need to be more immersed in it. Thankfully there are any number of ways to regularly take in and hold on to God's Word as you go through your week. To help us think about this I want to share with you the Word Hand Illustration from the Navigators. Each finger in the "Word Hand" is a way to have a greater grasp on God's Word. Little Finger – Hearing

Pastors and teachers teach from the Word provides fresh insight into the Scriptures. The weakest finger (the pinkie) represents hearing, because we retain only five percent of what we hear. Romans 10:17

Ring Finger – Reading

Reading gives us an overview of the Bible and is the foundation of a daily quiet time. This is represented by the ring finger. We generally retain 15 percent of what we read. Revelation 1:3

Middle Finger – Studying

Studying the Scriptures deepens our convictions. It requires greater time and effort but results in increased knowledge of the Bible. Most people retain 35 percent of what they study. This is represented by the middle finger. Acts 17:11

Index Finger – Memorizing

God's Word enables us to use Scripture, "the Sword of the Spirit" (Ephesians 6:17), to overcome temptations and to have verses readily available for ministering to others. The index finger, our strongest finger, represents memorization. We remember 100 percent of what we memorize if we consistently review it. Psalm 119:9-11


Thumb - Meditation

Meditation is the process that accompanies each of the other four methods of Scripture intake. This is why meditation is assigned to the thumb. Only the thumb can touch all the other four fingers. By meditating on God's Word as we hear, read, study, and memorize, we discover its transforming power at work in us. Psalm 1:2-3

My challenge to us this month: See where you are in your current interaction with God's Word, and add one more "finger" to your daily routine. If you only hear God's Word on Sundays, start reading God's Word a little each day. If you are hearing and reading, join a bible study to start studying God's Word with other believers. Maybe you need to try memorizing Scripture this month. But add a finger, and let me know what finger you are adding so I can pray for you. The more fingers you add, the more you will grasp and retain God's Word, and the more it will transform you from the inside out.
